Pastoral Reflection

Craving Pure Spiritual Milk

Becoming a father has introduced me to a rhythm of life I was never quite prepared for — one measured in hours between feeds, punctuated by insistent cries that cannot be ignored. My newborn daughter has made one thing abundantly clear: when she is hungry, she does not negotiate or delay. She craves milk with urgency, persistence, and complete dependence.

This experience has given fresh meaning to 1 Peter 2:2: “Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation.” The word “crave” stands out to me more than ever. In the original Greek, the term carries a sense of deep longing and earnest desire — not a mild preference, but an intense, almost desperate yearning. Observing my daughter, it led me to reflect upon my attitude towards God’s Word, which at times can be casual, or even optional. Yet, Scripture calls us to something far more wholehearted.

I am also struck by how entirely dependent my daughter is on milk. It is not a supplement to her life; it is her life. Without it, she simply cannot grow or thrive. In the same way, my spiritual life is not sustained by occasional inspiration or Sunday sermons alone. It depends fully on regular, consistent nourishment from God’s Word. This dependence is not a weakness — it is by design.

Another fascinating aspect of this season is learning how breast milk is not static, but dynamic. It alters its composition constantly based on the baby's changing needs to provide tailored nutrition and immune protection for the baby. For example, when a baby is ill, the baby's saliva sends biological signals to the mother's mammary glands, prompting the production of specific antibodies to combat the infection. In a similar way, God's Word is living and active (Hebrews 4:12). It speaks into our specific circumstances, addressing our fears, and encouraging us exactly where we are. It is never generic; it is deeply personal.

This new chapter of fatherhood has reminded me that spiritual growth requires both desire and dependence. May we learn to crave God's Word with the same urgency as a newborn, and to receive it daily as our essential nourishment.
